



The pathway project was completed as the second phase of a multi-phase project to provide a route north from Woodstock Village along Route 12. Dufresne Group provide planning, final design and permitting assistance.

The completed Woodstock Walkway project is a 2,500 ft, 5 ft wide, gravel path, from the Billings Farm to the Farmer's Market and replacement of the existing aggregate surface on an 850 lf existing gravel path that starts at the Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historical Park crosswalk and terminates at Billings Farm. The project also includes a wooden bridge to cross Pogue Brook. Miscellaneous work includes storm drainage improvements, grading and restoration of growth.

The pathway provides an important link from the National Park/Billings Farm Museum to the local farmers market.

### KEY FEATURES

- The design accommodated numerous drainage swales crossing the path route from the west.
- Preservation of an existing stone wall bordering the Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historic Park.
- Tree root protection and topsoil restoration was in strict accordance with Park personnel's requirements.
- The design accommodated the skewed culvert crossing Route 12 at Pogue Brook.
